This checklist helps you assess whether your business has the structural foundations required for long-term authority and search clarity.

Section 1 – Core Identity Clarity

Tick if true:

- My business name is used consistently across all platforms
 - My primary services are clearly defined and not vague
 - My service areas are clearly stated and consistent
 - There is no conflicting business information online

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Section 2 – Central Reference Point

- I have a structured central hub that clearly defines my business
 - My website acts as a clear authority reference

 - My services are structured in a logical hierarchy

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Section 3 – Supporting Authority Signals

- My business is represented consistently on trusted platforms
- My descriptions are aligned across profiles

- I have supporting authority properties beyond my main website
 - My business information reinforces itself rather than contradicts itself
 - My online presence looks structured rather than fragmented
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Section 4 – Expansion & Growth Readiness

- I could add new services without confusing structure
 - I could expand to new locations without creating overlap
 - My authority structure can grow without rebuilding
 - My online footprint is controlled and intentional
 - My visibility does not rely on one single platform
